About Us



The Hamilton Davies Trust is a charity which provides support to the communities of Irlam, Cadishead and Rixton-with-Glazebrook.

The Trustees award grants to sustainable projects which fulfil the charity's aims within the following six work streams:

- Communication
- Community
- Education
- Regeneration
- Sport
- Youth

The Trust also funds and manages its own projects within these areas of work.

Hamilton Davies House

The Hamilton Davies Trust is based at Hamilton Davies House, which is centrally located within the communities we support.

Formerly an unoccupied public house, the historic building has been restored and brought back into the heart of the community, now providing a venue for community groups to meet and visit the Trust. The facilities allow staff to give support, advice and assistance to community groups and volunteers.

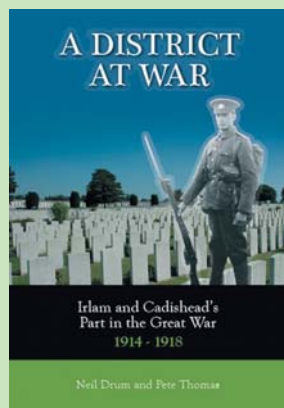


A District at War



During the year the Trust supported the publication of a book, written by two local men, Neil Drum and Pete Thomas. 'A District at War' records the involvement of Irlam and Cadishead in the First World War. A successful book launch was held at Hamilton Davies House in July 2010 which was attended by, amongst others, the authors' families and ex service men and women. The book is on sale at several venues throughout the district.

The authors are currently researching the area's involvement in the Second World War, with the aim of publishing a second book in the near future.



Communication

Throughout the year the Trust has supported various communication methods to ensure residents are kept well informed.

By running and managing the community websites for Irlam and Cadishead and Rixton-with-Glazebrook, residents have been able to read good news stories and find out about local events online.

Linking with M44.co.uk, the Trust funded a community directory, providing residents with knowledge of local groups, clubs and societies. This has been distributed to residential properties in Irlam, Cadishead and Rixton-with-Glazebrook twice within the year.

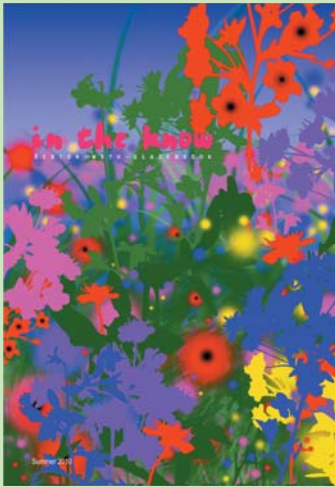
Knowing what activities are available for children and young people over the summer holidays is appreciated by parents. The Trust co-ordinated and funded the publication of a guide to What's Happening, this was distributed to families through schools and nurseries.

The Trust has continued to be actively involved in the management and promotion of the Digital Information Board. After funding the installation back in 2008, the Trust is delighted that the ability for community groups to advertise at this location has proven to be very beneficial with increased participation and awareness.

For 5 years the Trust has been producing a village newsletter for Rixton-with-Glazebrook. Volunteers have distributed thirteen editions of 'In the Know' by hand to every residential property in the village.

'In the Know' has proved a useful resource for the promotion of village activities. The Trust has assisted publicising Rixton-with-Glazebrook's Garden Safari and advertising the good work of the newly formed Friends of Hollinfare Cemetery with their aim to improve and enhance the look and feel of the cemetery.

The Trust continued to fund the printing costs of the walking guides 'Footpaths around Rixton' produced by two local volunteers.

Community

Cadishead Community Horticultural Society

The Trust was happy to support this group in their endeavour to provide classroom facilities on their community allotment site, by awarding a contribution towards a modular building.

The site, located just off Allotment Road in Cadishead, is used by various community groups including the most vulnerable members of our society; providing a safe and secure environment to learn about growing their own produce.



Cheshire Police Authority

The Trust continues to match fund the provision of a PCSO for Rixton-with-Glazebrook, improving communication between Police and the community.



Irlam and Cadishead Community First Responders

Community First Responders are local residents who are trained and equipped by North West Ambulance Service. They attend a range of emergency calls in advance of the arrival of ambulance crews, in order to begin medical assistance and life saving care as quickly as possible.

The Trust awarded a grant to provide our local team of volunteers with uniforms which ensures they are easily recognisable in an emergency situation and promotes their truly appreciated role.



Community

Irlam Male Voice Choir

Formed in April 1946, Irlam Male Voice Choir are a flourishing group of men who sing for their own enjoyment whilst aiding local churches and groups with funds raised at their concerts and performances.

After 20 years wear, new uniforms were needed for Irlam Male Voice Choir. The Trust was pleased to donate a third of the cost for the 30 strong choir's attire. We wish the choir every success as they continue to support other local causes.





Lucy Winskill Social Group and The Meadows Social Club

The Trust has given awards to two very worthwhile groups to help them continue to deliver a programme of activities and outings for our more senior residents.



Education

Irlam Endowed Primary School

The Trust is proud to support Irlam Endowed's passion for providing sporting opportunities for their pupils by awarding a grant to assist with the delivery of after-school and lunch time sports activities. The grant awarded also enabled the PE Co-ordinator to run a Sportsperson's Dinner to celebrate the achievements of the school's pupils and teams.

St Mary's CE Primary School

The Trust was happy to support St Mary's Toddler Group which meets in the school hall and offers an age appropriate environment for parents and toddlers to become familiar with their local school.

The grant awarded was used to buy much needed equipment to improve the quality of provision on offer to the youngest members of their school community.





Irlam and Cadishead Community High School

The Hamilton Davies Trust is a proud funder of the Manchester United Community Hub project, which is led by Manchester United Foundation who use football to change young peoples' lives for the better and the passion for Manchester United to educate, motivate and inspire young people. The project is based at Irlam and Cadishead Community High School and works in conjunction with all local primary schools.

The Trust is delighted to support this project which not only delivers football coaching sessions and encourages participation, but promotes healthy lifestyles through workshop based learning and offers life changing experiences.



Regeneration

During the year the Trust has continued to work closely with Salford City Council in our bid to rejuvenate pride and improve communal areas in Irlam and Cadishead.

The Trust has assisted financially in a tree planting scheme within a section of Cadishead and also has continued to maintain the landscaping around Cadishead Bridges.



Following discussions with local residents the Trust agreed, in partnership with Warrington Borough Council, to fund the installation of speeding signs on Glazebrook Lane.

Support has been given to Rixton-with-Glazebrook Parish Plan Steering Group as they progress towards the publication of a local Parish Plan.



Sport



Cadishead Sports JFC and Irlam Steel Recreation and Social Club

In order for sport to flourish, volunteer groundsmen spend hours each week lovingly caring for the grass pitches. To assist the groundsmen in their efforts the Trust contributed towards the purchase of new mowers for two of our sports facilities.



Irlam and Cadishead New Age Kurling

The Trust is pleased to support Irlam and Cadishead New Age Kurling group who meet weekly at the Acorn Centre. Promoting a relatively new sport to the community, the group, who cater for all ages and abilities hope to expand their membership and join a league. We hope that support from the Trust will assist this group in their developments.



Sport

Luke Wood

Luke is a very talented local swimmer who represents Great Britain. His commitment to the sport sees him training for 30 hours a week alongside studying, for a degree in Sport Science. The Trust was happy to contribute towards Luke's expenses and awarded funds for him to attend a training camp in Italy in preparation for Olympic Games' selection.





ICY Positive Moves

The Trust was pleased to support holiday activities run by ICY Positive Moves at Cadishead Hall over the summer holiday period.

The organisation endorses positive changes to the lives of children, young people and families by providing safe and age appropriate activities for 5 – 19 year olds. The holiday activities were held in the evening and included a wide range of fun, safe and challenging activities.

Rixton Youth Club

The Trust is delighted to support Culcheth Methodist Church to deliver a youth club in the village of Hollins Green. This links directly with youth provision they deliver in the neighbouring town of Culcheth and programmes delivered in Culcheth High School.

The youth club runs once a week from Hollins Green Scout Centre.

The Trust supports the cost of this delivery for the young people in the Rixton-with-Glazebrook community.



Youth

Rixton-with-Glazebrook School Holiday Programme

The Trust has continued to support the co-ordination of activities delivered over school holidays for the young residents of Rixton-with-Glazebrook.

Funding was provided for the provision of a free, open access multi-sports programme on St Helen's School Field. Delivered by Salford Community Leisure, these sessions were run daily over Easter, Whit and Summer holidays for 5-16 year olds and offered a variety of sports and games under the supervision of qualified sports coaches and dance tutors.

Joining the summer programme was Kids Rhythm, who hosted the very popular arts and crafts workshops, offering creative hands on art and crafts sessions within Hollins Green Scout Centre.
